The Canaan Baptist Church Virtual Conference of July 29, 2023 via Zoom 1 was called to order by Pastor Brennan at 9:57am with a song "Sweet, Sweet Spirit", prayer by Deacon Troy Boyd: Old Testament reading, Isaiah 56:6-7 by Deacon George Waters, New Testament reading, 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 by Deacon Michael Bryant.

Pastor welcomed and thanked everyone, if anyone didn't get a packet the link is listed in the chat feature

A motion was made by Trustee Emmet Mayo and seconded by Sister Ernestine Preston to accept the minutes of the January 28, 2023 conference found on pages 6-8 of the packet as written. The motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor stated that he will not read his report but will speak from his heart regarding hopes, gratitude and his goals for the next six months.

- This has been a blessed year, grateful for twenty-one (21) new disciples, thirteen (13) receiving RHOF
- Hybrid Initiative continues, Sister Ella Herbin reports a count of over 200 in person worshippers per Sunday
- Virtual watchers holding steady 500/600 with zoom, phone ins, YouTube, streaming, counting on demand watchers
- Beginning to do some in person studies: Women's Bible study, Mature Adults studies on Thursdays
- Text to join is significant
- Those home bound and in nursing homes are grateful they can stay connected to their church
- Sick & Shut In List now called Healing and Restoration List is available on website
- By August we hope to provide an electronic version of our Newsletter and Sunday Bulletin
- How do we ministry to all those virtual worshipers, how do we enable them to receive/give ministry?
- Sometimes we need a physical touch, sometimes you need to come into the church
- See detail finance report: thank God the church is solvent, we can pay our bills
- Thank God for those stepping up with their tithing, Gem Endowment matching campaign exceled
- Major projects on the horizon: redo kitchen in Fellowship Hall/Lower Dining room, air conditioner compressor operating at 50% need replacing, many others things need to be improved or built upon, we must be good stewards over the blessing of this building and satellite prop-
- Grateful to sow into building but even more urgent that we sow into the lives of people, must do more across the generations, more for teens and mature adults
- We need to raise even more money going into the future, outreach is mandatory
- Paused on the hiring of additional ministerial staff to concentrate on building needs
- Praise God for Treasurer Darlene Athey and Director Cliff Jones, they're doing an outstanding job managing our finances and our building.
- Prayer is #1, we are praying for things in the future, prayer is paramount for the church

With no questions a motion was made by Deacon Michael Bryant and seconded by Brother Mark Trent to accept the Pastoral report. The motion carried.

DEACON'S MINISTRY REPORT

Chairperson Deacon George Waters stated "Love is the key word", every Wednesday the Deacons with Deaconess host noon day prayer service, they are going back to visiting members in hospitals and in homes for communion, anyone requiring prayer should call the church office, about a six month ago training began for new candidates James Davis & James Coppedge under the leadership of Deacon Parker & Deacon Paige, they have been accepted by Pastor, the Deacon Board and the Nomination Committee. Another class is scheduled sometime before January. Always looking for new candidates. Our challenge is how to meet the needs of our online worshippers. Pastor commented: Well done, he encouraged Canaanites to call the church office to notify your Deacon of celebrations/challenges so they can assist you in your needs. He is excited about the new candidates.

With no questions a motion was made by Brother Terrell Parris and seconded by Deacon Troy Boyd to accept the Deacon's Ministry Report. The motion carried.

TRUSTEE MINISTRY REPORT

Chairperson Trustee William Jones thanked everyone for their ongoing support. Suggested you also read the Director's Report on pages 32/33. Among many accomplishments, have begun evaluating new banking relationships, roof repair in fellowship Hall completed, heating system enhanced, two new office positions filled, buses moved to more secure location, looking for new Trustees, \$7,600 per month in rental income, loan to be satisfied by end of 2024, please observe all posted or announced safety protocols, safety is paramount. You may call the church office at any time with your concerns.

Pastor commented: There is a lot of work being done, we commend the Trustees for being faithful stewards.

Questions/Concerns

- Regarding the staff and calling the church office, it is too businesslike, system is frustrating, too automated. Ans: We will look into it
- What is protocol for reserving space, forms & guidelines to get approval? Ans: Call the office to request a form as soon as you know, we will get back to you within 14 days, physical forms are in the office.
- How do we post event announcements? Ans: You must forward to office, then Pastor for approval. No outside events will be announced.
- How to get information regarding other church members? Ans: call family Deacon, call office and they will pass on your number to that person
- When will Mastery parking lot be fully opened? Ans: Not a Canaan propriety, we have permission to use on Sundays, everyone is encouraged to park correctly and legally, we cannot enforce parking laws there. We have been told construction will be completed by fall.
- Protocol for ministry or individuals reserving church space? Ans: Again-contact office
- Is the app you are referring to different from the current app? Ans: No, it is the same, Gem Family app.
- When will kitchen will be ready, can we get new tiles? Ans: We are looking to do a complete rebuilding of the kitchen and that will include flooring, lightening, everything new. Pray.
- Will we ever get back to selling sermon CDs? Ans: Pastor will speak with Deacon Cromwell regarding a limited number, no mass production.
- What is the process for scheduling a meeting Ans: Same process as events
- App? Seniors are not tech savvy, what is the plan for them? Ans: Will always maintain a traditional process to cover every generation
- Facebook, there are two separate pages, can we combine those pages to avoid confusion? Ans: First page is external, anyone can view. Second page is internal messages by Rev. Parker, for Canaanites.
- Unisex bathroom in fellowship Hall? Ans: Included in project goals, see page 27.

A motion was made by Sister Laurie Casey and seconded by Sister LaWanda Hawkins to accept the Trustee Ministry report. The motion carried.

Pastor commented: There will be a separate call session for major projects

FINANCE/TREASURER REPORT

Treasurer Report: Treasurer Darlene Athey apologized for being off camera. Cash on hand as of June 30, 2023 is \$406,640.50 which includes, United Bank construction loan balance \$646.33, Gem Endowment balance \$123,189.17, Operating account 105,975.95, etc.

A motion was made by Trustee Debra Geiger Swanson & seconded by Deacon Charles Cromwell to accept the Treasurer's Report. The motion carried.

<u>Financial Report</u> Trustee Ralph Vaden, stating this is a snapshot of where we have gone the last six months. Directed us to actual revenue 2023-\$754,749.00, expenses \$592,267.00, a difference of \$162,482.00 (inside of this is an allocated/restricted funds of \$100,000.00). We are operating in the black.

Additional comment by Chairman Jones: We work to reflect an actuate & transparent picture of how the church is doing, going forward you will see a separate report regard the Gem Endowment and satellite properties. New format will be ready by next conference. No reason for alarm, just making sure we present an accurate financial picture.

Questions/Concerns:

- Is budget reflecting six month or year of actual expenses? Ans: Budget is set for the year, numbers reflect ½ way point although it is a yearly budget
- Are we concerned about the numbers, budgeted vs actual? Ans: Always looking at where we stand 2023 budget is one of the most conservatives ever presented, going forward we will have a better picture
- Page 28, cash on hand-construction loan, are numbers correct? Ans; Yes, from original loan

A motion was made by Sister Valerie Johnson & seconded by Trustee Liz Perry to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Pause: A question was asked regarding tabling the motion until we get a clearer picture of the report Ans: the numbers will remain the same, there will only be more details

Discussion ensued regarding a separate motion to table the report until details are presented: Conclusion reached this was not necessary.

Original motion by Sister Valerie Johnson and Trustee Liz Perry was accepted and voted upon to accept the Financial report. The motion carried.



Your Trustees remain committed to ensuring good stewardship of the church's assets and finances and the maintenance of our physical properties. We always pray you will remain faithful with your prayers and financial contributions as the mission and operation of the church continue.

Several responsibilities, in whole or in part, are delegated and entrusted to our Director of Operations who collaborates with the Trustees, the Pastor, and other key leaders to facilitate the day-to-day operation of the church.

Accomplishments in 2023

We were able to accomplish the following only by the grace of God, your prayers, and your generous financial support:

Finance & Budget

- Remained within the 2023 budget and financial plan, ending the year solvent and with revenue exceeding expenses (see Finance & Budget Report)
- Approved and established a new banking relationship with WSFS Bank.
 - Phased transition of banks is underway, in partnership with the Church Treasurer
- Approved a balanced 2024 Operating Budget of \$1,339,267.00
- Reduced the balance on the existing construction loan by 38% to ~\$55,000.00.

Facilities Management

- Completed roofing and cosmetic repairs in the Fellowship Hall, Lower Dining Room, Chapel, Sanctuary, and 300 W School House Lane among other areas.
- Completed HVAC replacement at 300 W School House Ln.
- Mitigated water intrusion issues in several areas of the main building.
- Completed electrical upgrades in the Sanctuary, Fellowship Hall, and other spaces.
- Continued with repairs and enhancements to the heating and air conditioning systems.
- Continued with plumbing repairs and enhancements in several areas.

Safety & Security

- Negotiated a one-year contract with a new, more secure location to store our fleet.
- Resumed providing round-trip transportation for members on Sunday mornings (GEM Shuttle).

Miscellaneous

- Hosted the September meeting of the Citywide Trustees of Greater Philadelphia.
- Added cameras and related equipment to enhance streaming of worship, baptism, and other events from the Sanctuary and Atterbeary/Holcomb Chapel.
- Approved an updated pricing list for non-ministry facility rentals, in partnership with the Deacons and Events Ministry.

Objectives for First & Second Quarters 2024

In the next 6 months and beyond, your Trustees will work to achieve several critical objectives above and beyond our regular duties. Some of these are carryovers from the previous reporting period and include, but are not limited to:

Human Resources

- Continue evaluation of staffing needs and updating job descriptions and responsibilities in several departments and ministries.
- Continue updating handbooks, policies, and development for key leaders, employees, contractors, and appointees.
- Evaluation of a potential electronic timekeeping system.
- Deployment of the Code of Conduct & Ethics for church ministers, officers, leaders, and employees.

Facilities Management

- Ongoing mitigation of heating, plumbing, and water intrusion issues.
- Repair or replacement of key components of the air conditioning system (See Infrastructure Improvement Planning).
- Reorganization of space allocation and usage.
- A new round of applications for grants or partnerships for the restoration or upgrading of key areas of the church campus.
- Restoration of existing furniture and procurement of new furniture for the Multipurpose Room and Chapel.
- Audiovisual enhancements in Fellowship Hall and the Classroom Area

Risk Management & Stewardship

- Deployment of the Canaan Baptist Church Code of Conduct & Ethics for key leaders and staff
- Ongoing evaluation of the church's insurance policies and other risk management coverages
- Ongoing inventorying and digitization of records and key historical documents
- Evaluation of new data management software for church demographic and financial recordkeeping

Finance & Budget

- Streamlining and reorganization of budget reporting and the chart of accounts
- Evolving the church's financial tools and vehicles (lines of credit, savings accounts, investments, etc.).
- Streamlining/Automation of the church's accounts payable procedures.

Safety & Security

- Ongoing staged replacement of the video surveillance systems
- Procurement of new, upgraded two-way radios and other communication equipment.
- Ongoing development of fire and emergency egress plans
- Analysis and upgrade/replacement of the security alarm and fire alarm systems

Infrastructure Improvement Planning

The Trustees are in collaboration with the Deacons, the Director of Operations, and the Senior Pastor on an accelerated infrastructure improvement project. The purpose is to facilitate completion of renovations and improvements in key areas of the church in a consolidated and coordinated manner. Significant initial assessments were completed in 2023 at no charge to the church. An initial proposal, which is under review, has not been formalized, a project name has not been chosen, costs and financing have not been identified, and a timeline has not been set. Although significant progress has been made, these aspects are still under evaluation and design. A proposal to the congregation will be presented in 2024 once formalized and approved by the Joint Leadership. Potential areas to be included in this project will be, but are not limited to:

- General
 - Roofing, drainage, electrical upgrades, technology enhancements, masonry, signage
- Main Sanctuary & Narthex
 - Lighting, additional technology enhancements, entryway enhancements
- Fellowship Hall & Lower Dining Room
 - Lighting, flooring, restrooms, audiovisual systems, kitchen equipment, kitchen layout, space redesign/partitioning
- Air Conditioning Systems
 - Blowers, chillers, ductwork, automation
- Classroom Area & Lower Level
 - Space reconfiguration, technology and connectivity enhancements, audiovisual systems
- 300 W School House Lane (proposed)
 - All remaining construction phases

The Trustees thank Director Clifton Jones and First Lady Alberta Brennan, Esq. for their ongoing leadership and project management which has been invaluable to the rebuilding of Canaan's property portfolio. We continue to thank the congregation for its prayers and support.

Director of Operations 2023 Year-End Report

The following details are a general summary of current and planned activities. The Director would like to thank the Canaan membership for their continued partnership as we all work towards the advancement of Pastor Brennan's vision, mission and the advancement of the Kingdom. To God be the Glory!

General Observations

Due to the conservative nature of the 2024 budget year, the Director of Operations has had to reduce the operations budget, which is a double-edged sword. We do benefit from planned expense reduction; however, we cannot anticipate when a key building system will fail and require unexpected funding.

Space Usage - It has been observed that some members/ministries continue to use rooms and spaces without prior a prior approved reservation. We respectfully ask that room usage is scheduled in advance via the main office as there may be existing reservations, planned maintenance, or other factors which congregation may not be aware of. Rooms/space may be requested by calling and/or emailing the church office during business hours.

Process Improvements - Director collaborating with the History committee to facilitate improved process for display of Canaan historical memorabilia in designated areas around the church.

Facility Maintenance

- Heating systems are currently undergoing major repair to the one-hundred-year-old steam pipes to prevent unexpected pipe failure mid-winter. This was an unexpected expense.
- Leaf removal was conducted for all satellite properties.
- General Heating Director is additionally identifying associated heating zones and areas that need attention for improved control and heat. For example, Daycare corridor - need to diagnose and reconnect one forward radiator and possibly add and additional radiator to hallway; Jamison Hall - need to clean two radiator traps and possibly add additional radiators to compensate for high ceilings and large area. Director consistently in collaboration with the facilities committee. New water softener company engaged.
- Deacons Office wall waterproofing is being revisited with new company.

Multimedia and Technology

- Canaan is currently exploring a more robust congregation database system. The current system is becoming a legacy product and will not be supported in the future.
- Director & Trustees exploring sound console enhancements in the Sanctuary to support expansion of capabilities and to mitigate some existing channels which are malfunctioning.

Customer Service

Canaanites are encouraged to report any/all issues to observations@canaanbaptistchurch.org, "if you see something, say something."

Risk, Safety, and Security

- Recent alarm system equipment failures are in the process of being resolved. Director is having a variety of parts and components replaced to prevent future incidents.
- Director will continue to collaborate with the Security Committee as a follow-up to the initial "Active Shooter" Training recently held.

Satellite Properties

- Satellite rental efforts have been successful. Canaan has recent acquired four new tenants.
- T-stat inspections conducted on all satellite properties. Currently two T-stats drain the batteries weekly to our detriment. Now that we are in winter months, heat must be controlled and maintained in buildings to prevent pipes bursting due to freezing weather. Security tours have been set up to check conditions daily.
- Director is continuing to systematically maintain all licensing needed for all satellite properties, including Lead Safety Certifications, Activity Licenses, City Tax Accounts, Rental Licenses, and Use & Occupancy Permits.

Resource Development

Efforts continue for outside donors and programs consistent with the Canaan/Family Life Center mission and for other church needs/initiatives.

Director Action Items - 2024

- Director scheduling reorganization of the equipment room in collaboration with Deacons &
- Organizing and clean up need to be completed in the Teen Room and Uganda Room as soon as possible.
- Inventorying of all breaker boxes so they can be properly marked with location labels to include additional labeling of certain problematic outlets.
- Replacement of two-way radios and other communication devices are being researched by the Director and Security Committee for near-future acquisition.
- Electrical upgrades/enhancements in the Sanctuary to support future equipment installation.
- Pulpit lighting repairs/enhancements.
- Exterior lighting repairs/enhancements.
- Garage needs electrical repairs/enhancements for lighting and door functionality.

Director Recommendations

- Obtain software subscription for tenant and rental interaction.
- Annual review of all CBC Governing Documents for risk management considerations
